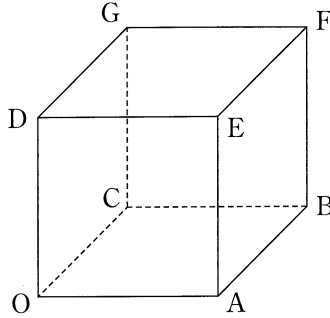

Crossing the ocean on a yacht can be one of the most exciting, but at the same time dull, challenges that you can undertake. If the weather suddenly changes and a storm approaches, life is anything but boring—in fact, it can get very dangerous! And if dolphins, whales, or other (81) swim beside your boat in the middle of the ocean, it is incredibly interesting and beautiful. On the other hand, you can sail for weeks without seeing land or even another boat. Face-to-face (82) is limited to the people on board with you, although you can still speak to others via radio.

Most sailors are well prepared and bring along all the food and water they need for a journey. However, you cannot anticipate everything that could happen on a trip across the ocean, and sometimes (83) run out. In that case, it is necessary to find your own food and collect your own rainwater when it rains. If you are lucky and do catch a (84), it is thrilling. It is not easy cooking on a small boat though, especially when the seas are rough. So, you often eat the same food over and over again, which can be quite tiresome.

Being isolated for a long time can make you appreciate other humans more. It also allows you the time to read many good books. However, if you really want to get away from your yacht for a while, you do not have that (85). So, somewhat paradoxically, ocean crossings are adventures that are both loved and hated by sailors around the world.

Smallpox is a disease that killed around half a billion people from 1880 to 1980. It was previously known as speckled monster and red plague because of the red spots that covered the skin of those infected. The (91) of the illness are unclear, but are often attributed to African rodents, such as rats and gerbils. Although cowpox has a similar DNA structure to smallpox, it is not a deadly disease. Given its name, we can work out which animal can carry this disease. In the eighteenth century, Edward Jenner promoted the use of the cowpox virus as a natural vaccine. When infected with this virus, people develop immunity against smallpox.

This immunity can be developed naturally in people who have been exposed to the actual disease. The other way is to develop immunity by being exposed to a weaker form of the disease through (92). The World Health Organization ran a very successful campaign, which has resulted in no new cases of smallpox since the late 1970s. This has potentially saved over a quarter of a billion people over the last five (93). Although there is considerable evidence supporting the benefits of vaccination, some parents, known as anti-vaxxers, refuse to have their children vaccinated. Anti-vaxxers tend to focus on the possible side effects, but fail to consider the effect of their choices on the (94).

Measles is a disease that can cause death, particularly in children. Countries, such as the United States and the Netherlands, had almost eliminated measles. However, the increase in the number of anti-vaxxers has led to increases in the number of cases of measles.
